Intent	Implementation
More CPD for staff with new planning in place during Autumn term.	Make sure all staff know the new plans and are using the Sports coaches expertise to help.

Increase the percentage of children that can swim at the end of year 6.	Having a pool in school and all the school having access to this will help.
